# **Escrick Heritage Group Meeting. 7th August.**

The group meets on the first Wednesday of each month in Escrick Church, starting at the new time of 7.30pm, and has evolved from the original volunteers meetings. The theme this month will be the history of Escrick Primary school, formerly Escrick Park school, when we will be looking at the temporary exhibition created by the school children.

Non-members are also very welcome but will be asked to contribute £2 at each meeting.
