Fire broke out at the Menagery
Farm on Sunday September 11th 1892
about 1/2 past eleven o'clock
which was not extinguished until
Monday the following day at 7 p m
at night the damages were
estimated at 1000.200 pounds which
were fully ensured Rowley Farm Bailib

day of November 1892 which was
given by Mr J G Menzies & his wife
