


Judith also has her Grandmother, Kate's, Grocery book from 1913 when Major Eley had an account with the York Grocers, S Borders & Co.

## **Escrick Parish Magazine 1897**


On the right is a copy of the February 1897 Escrick Parish magazine from the bound copy shared by Eileen. The children obviously had a great time at Christmas.
