Easter is the greatest festival of the church's year. At Easter we celebrate what God has done in Jesus, how though Jesus had been put to death, now he is Risen. The pain and anguish of the Passion of Jesus has gone and we celebrate the power of God in bringing his son Jesus from death to new life.
