We have our first United 3 service for Escrick, Stillingfleet and Naburn starting. Please do join us as we begin this new pattern of services together on the 4 th of September at Stillingfleet Church at 10.30am. We have an exciting new start and I love it!

Of course, in different places and different cultures new year, new terms, new starts are all at very different times of the year and for different reasons. When I was thinking about this my mind went to today, because as a Christian I believe that with every sunrise a new day starts, a new day full of possibilities and opportunities. The amazing wonder of God is that with God we get to start every day afresh, with God it doesn't matter what happened yesterday because it is what happens today that is important. This promise of a new start for everyone every day isn't just for Christians it is for everyone. Every day well lived gives us happy memories of yesterday and a wonderful tomorrow.
