

The Tomlinson family sword

Thank you very much to Eileen for sharing a photograph and information about her donation of the sword belonging to Sefton Tomlinson to the Treasurer House in Beverley.

As you may remember the actual handover took place at one of our Escrick Heritage Group meetings. Here is the press release..... 17 Apr 2023:



Ceremonial Sword donated to East Riding Yeomanry Display in Beverley

To mark the opening of a new mini display at the Treasure House in Beverley featuring artefacts relating to the East Riding Yeomanry, a relative of one of the soldiers from the regiment took part in the official unveiling.

Eileen Tutill from York, the granddaughter of Quartermaster Sergeant Sefton Tomlinson (of Escrick), has donated her relative's ceremonial sword, which dates to the years before the First World War.

Said Dr. David Marchant, museums registrar with East Riding of Yorkshire Council:

"This donation originally came about as a result of a lecture I delivered at Escrick to the local history society. The village has a close connection with the East Riding Yeomanry, as this was where Lord Wenlock first raised the regiment in 1902, and there were many local men, like Sefton Tomlinson, who joined at that time."

It's a great addition to our collection of artefacts related to the East Riding Yeomanry. The sword has an interesting later history, being used at special family events – cutting wedding cakes, for instance!

'The sword is part of a recent acquisitions display, also featuring a WWI period photograph album and a WWII diary. The display will run until the end of August this year.
